# Homily 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Easter

The Gospel of this Second Sunday of the Easter season tells us about the first meeting of the risen Lord with the entire community of the apostles, a moment of joy and forgiveness. The apostles knew the risen Lord as one who forgives and offers peace and salvation. We can imagine how the apostles would have been happy to see the risen Lord, but on the other hand, they were restrained in their emotions as they waited to see Jesus' reaction. Don't forget that these men had denied the Lord and they had abandoned him as he hung on the cross. The Lord, however, made no allusion to the abandonment, nor did he complain about their cowardly betrayal and denial. He made no requirement of reparation for the pain caused by the apostles. This encounter between the risen Jesus and the Early Church was a meeting of forgiveness in which the apostles experienced the joy and peace that are the fruit of reconciliation and friendship with God. They all had reason to be ashamed, but here the Gospel presents to us the first fruits of resurrection: peace. "Peace Be With You!" This was the greeting of Jesus and it is also the gift he gives his Church. It is precisely this offer of forgiveness and peace that brings joy and hope into the lives of the apostles. Today, like the apostles, we are the heirs of this peace and this joy that springs from God's forgiveness for our sins.

This is the experience that we must all carry out: be people of peace and peacemakers. The resurrection of Jesus teaches us not to look backward to the past or dwell on failures that may embarrass us. We now look forward to what the Lord expects of us. "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." The resurrection teaches us to experience forgiveness from God and with hearts full of joy, to witness to a world which is sometimes so forlorn, the peace of the Risen Lord.
