Homily 1st Sunday of Lent

Today we are starting the Lenten season that is a time of conversion. Today we are starting this path together with Jesus towards his cross and resurrection. In this path of conversion the Church helps us especially through the liturgy of Sunday Mass. Today, for example, the readings of the Word of God that we listen to assure us that God is interested in destroying the old world of selfishness and sin and giving to mankind a new world full of life and unending happiness.

The first reading that we heard today is a part of the history of the flood and it says to us that God removes sin and comes to meet mankind, and makes to us an unconditional covenant of peace. The action of God is intended to bring about the birth of a new humanity, which travels the path of love and justice, the path of true life.

The second reading, from the First Letter of Peter, reminds us that by Baptism Christians accept Christ and the salvation which He came to offer. In this way we are committed to follow Jesus on the path of love and service, in the path of delivering our own life and thus becoming the beginning of a new humanity.

The Gospel of the "temptation in the wilderness" shows us that Jesus was confronted with options throughout his life. He had to choose between living in fidelity to the Father's plans and making his life a gift of love or embarking on a path of selfishness and self-sufficiency. Jesus, of course, chose to live in obedience to his Father's plans to the point of surrendering his own life.

Those of us who want to be disciples of Jesus, we are constantly confronted with the same options. Following Jesus is to accept God's plan and do it faithfully, making our own life an offer of love and service to our brothers and sisters. This is the reason why we need conversion and the reason why Lent is a time that is so important to us.

The question that the Church addresses to each one of us today is: Am I willing to start Lent and follow the path of conversion?
